POSTER CONTEST RULES

Category A: Free-hand Drawing	Category B: Computer-Generated
<p>Entry is open to children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews between the ages of 5 and 12 of CSSE members and/or NAOSH Week Regional Committee members and/or your colleagues, fellow employees, neighbours and/or friends.</p> <p>There will be four age categories with a winner from each age category: 1) ages 5-6, 2) ages 7-8, 3) ages 9-10, and, 4) ages 11-12.</p>	<p>Entry is open to children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews between the ages of 5 and 18 of CSSE members and/or NAOSH Week Regional Committee members and/or your colleagues, fellow employees, neighbours and/or friends.</p> <p>There will be four age categories with a winner from each age category: 1) 12 & under, 2) ages 13-14, 3) ages 15-16, and, 4) ages 17-18.</p>
<p>The poster drawing must relate to the theme "Safety on the Job" and should illustrate an example of safety at work. As you know, the description of the workplace is wide-ranging -- it can be at an office, a manufacturing plant, on the road, in a plane, on a train, a ship, a dock, at home, at the country's borders, a store, fire or police department, construction sites, parks, pools, schools, etc. We urge you to encourage your children to be creative. The NAOSH Week theme of Making It Work! may also be incorporated.</p>	<p>Design a poster that illustrates the contest theme of "Safety on the Job". The description of the workplace is wide-ranging -- it can be at an office, a manufacturing plant, on the road, in a plane, on a train, a ship, a dock, at home, at the country's borders, a store, fire or police department, construction sites, parks, pools, schools, etc. The NAOSH Week theme of Making It Work! may also be incorporated.</p>
<p>The finished poster must be no larger than 11" x 14". Designs should be submitted on quality poster illustration board or heavy paper. Crayons or drawing pencils only should be used.</p>	<p>The final artwork must be designed and submitted in an electronic format, as a .JPG file, .BMP file, .TIF file or PDF file. Maximum allowable file size is 2 MB. Submissions received in other formats will be returned.</p> <p>Entries by any other means will not be accepted in this category.</p> <p>Creativity is encouraged. Personal photographs and/or clip art can be used; however, points for creativity may be jeopardized.</p>
